Gentlemen:

We are enclosing herewith Form 1023, Exemption Application, pursuant to Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, on behalf of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness, Inc., 26 Second Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10003. You will note from the application and the supplemental materials submitted in connection with question 10 that the Society is a religious order incorporated as a religious corporation under the laws of the State of New York and is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes.

The following are the answers to the subsections of question 10:

- 10 a. A copy of the Articles of Incorporation of the Society is annexed hereto.
- 10 b. A copy of the Constitution and By-Laws under which the Society is presently operating is annexed hereto.
- 10 c. A statement of the assets of the Society as of November 1, 1966 is annexed hereto. There are no current liabilities.
- 10 d. A monthly statement of receipts and expenditures for the period from July 1966 (when the Society was incorporated and began operating) through and including October, 1966 is annexed herewith.
- 10 e. See paragraph FOURTH of Certificate of Incorporation.
- 10 f. The specific purpose for which the Society was formed is for the worship of Krishna through prayer and congregational chanting and to teach and propogate the Bhagawat Gita to the members of the Society and others.
- 10 j. The Society contemplates, at such time in the future as it has sufficient assets, to purchase a building to house its temple. Moreover, the Society is paying rent in the sum of \$125.00 a month for a store at No. 26 Second Avenue, New York, N.Y. which it is

10 j. presently using as a temple for its devotional services. The Society also pays rent in the sum of \$71.99 a month for an apartment at the same address. This apartment is used as a residence for Mr. A.C. Bhaktivedanta, the Society of Acharya Religious Leader, and which is also used for meetings and devotional services. Both premises are leased from Connecticut Investors Corp., 38 East 76th Street, New York, N.Y.
